



Improvements at the Lebanon Hills Visitor Center Trailhead Lebanon Hills Regional Park, Eagan

Frequently Asked Questions:

What's happening this fall?

The Lebanon Hills Visitor Center campus and Trailhead are getting an upgrade! This area will be under construction and **CLOSED September 6 through mid-November 2011**.

Will the Visitor Center still be open?

No. The Lebanon Hills Visitor Center will also be **CLOSED** during this time.

Will the outside bathrooms or drinking fountain be available?

No. No public access will be permitted around the Visitor Center campus area.

Can I access the park from this trailhead? Can I park and hike in the park?

No. The entrance road will be used for construction traffic **ONLY**. No public access will be available at the Visitor Center Trailhead.

Can I walk or bike along the entrance road?

No. The entrance road will be used for construction traffic **ONLY**. No public access will be available.

Where else can I park to hike in Lebanon Hills Regional Park?

Please take this opportunity to access the park and explore nearby Holland Lake and Jensen Lake Trailheads in Lebanon Hills Regional Park. Holland Lake Trailhead is located at 1100 Cliff Road in Eagan. Jensen Lake Trailhead is located at 1350 Carriage Hills Drive in Eagan.

Are there any closed hiking or horse trails?

Yes. Certain segments of the hiking trails near the Visitor Center campus construction site will be closed. Signs will be posted in the field indicating closed areas and park trail maps updated with the affected areas.

What if I'm registered for an education program or activity?

All education programs and activities have been relocated to other park facilities. You should have received an updated confirmation notice from park staff. Please call Krista Jensen, Dakota County Park Education Coordinator at 651-554-6534 to confirm the location for your program or activity.

What do the Visitor Center campus and Trailhead improvements include?

- An updated parking lot to better manage storm water runoff and improve water quality.
- Better trails to improve accessibility, visitor safety and orientation.
- Increased picnicking and group gathering opportunities.
