The Dakota County Public Health Department (DCPH) provides a broad range of services to individuals, families and communities to promote and protect the health of the residents of Dakota County. Through home visits and public health clinics, we offer prevention, early intervention and case management services to individuals and families. Population-based prevention services are available to youth and communities to promote healthy behaviors. Programs and resources highlighted below illustrate the range of the services available for individuals and families.

Asthma Program

The Dakota County Asthma Program is free for children ages 0-18 who live in Dakota County and have been diagnosed with asthma. It includes up to three visits from a public health nurse. Families may be eligible to receive equipment to decrease asthma triggers.

Child and Teen Checkups

The Child and Teen Checkups program works with families, community partners and health professionals to increase access to regular, high quality preventive medical and dental care for youth birth to age 21 who receive Medical Assistance. The Family Health programs focus on promoting the health and well-being of families by providing home visits to support families during pregnancy, after delivery, and the first years of a child's life. Mental Health Services for Children

The Help Me Grow Program offers free evaluation, assessment and services for children with developmental concerns from birth to five years old. Women, Infants & Children (WIC) Program

WIC is a nutrition program that helps eligible families eat well and stay healthy. WIC offers:

- Nutrition information specific to your family's needs
- Breastfeeding education and support
- Healthy foods
- Referrals to other health and community programs

If you are pregnant, recently had a baby, or care for a child under age 5, you may qualify for WIC.

WIC eligibility is based on income level and/or participation in programs such as:

- Free or Reduced School Lunch
- SNAP (Food Stamps)
- MN Healthcare Programs-Medical Assistance, Minnesota Care
- Minnesota Family Investment Program (MFIP)
- SSI or TEFRA for the individual on these programs
