Limiting cost increases

They fund public safety services, care for vulnerable children and adults, road construction and maintenance, and environmental protection. We do our best to provide those services in the most cost-effective way.

In 2024, Dakota County will not raise the property tax levy by more than 3.5 percent. We know property taxes are among many factors that affect your household budget. Just as household costs have increased, so have the costs for county government. We do everything we can to limit that cost to taxpayers.

As you review your statement, remember that only a small portion of your property taxes fund county government. Cities, schools and other taxing districts also levy property tax.
