# REDUCE

REDUCE FOOD WASTE BY SHOPPING, EATING AND SAVING SMARTER

#### **Buy smart**

- Make a shopping list and stick to it to save money and make fewer shopping trips.
- Five bananas for \$1 is a deal, but only if you eat all five. Many stores offer the sale price even if you buy a lower quantity.
- Shop the bulk bins for grains, nuts and spices so you purchase only the quantity you will use.
- Check your pantry, fridge and freezer before making your grocery list.
- Shop the salad bar for dishes or salads that call for small amounts of different types of vegetables.

#### Keep foods fresh longer

- Place ripe avocados in the fridge.
- Keep herbs longer by putting their stems in a glass of water.
- Store flour in the freezer to keep it fresh almost twice as long.
- Wrap leftover cheese loosely in wax paper — not plastic.

 Place a slice of bread in your brown sugar to soften it up.

#### Revitalize food you thought was inedible

- Reinvigorate wilted veggies with a quick 5-10-minute soak in ice water.
- Make stale chips and crackers crisp again with a minute or two in a regular or toaster oven.
- Fix salty soups by adding vinegar, lemon juice, brown sugar, water, crushed tomatoes or unsalted broth.
- Remove much of the burned flavor from foods by scooping the unblackened portion into a new pot and covering it with a damp cloth for 10 minutes.
- Puree overcooked vegetables to transform them into soups or sauces.

#### SAVE MONEY, ENERGY AND NATURAL RESOURCES BY FIXING AND REUSING

#### Donate, repurpose and buy used

Extend the life of items you no longer need or want by donating or repurposing them and save money by buying used. A number of donation centers and shops to buy used are located in Dakota County. www.dakotacounty.us, search donate your stuff.

#### Repair your stuff at a Fix-it Clinic

FIX: Tclinica Get help fixing household items for free at a monthly Dakota County Fix-it Clinic. Residents can bring everything from clothes to jewelry and coffee makers to vacuums for free help with repairs. If you like troubleshooting repairs on broken items or mending clothes, consider volunteering at a Fix-it Clinic, www.dakotacountv.us. search fix-it clinics.

#### **Get free products**

Before buying new products, stop by the Reuse Area at The Recycling Zone to pick up paint, cleaning products, fertilizer and more for free. Products change every day so stop by often. Have extra products you no longer need? Bring them in for others to use. Must be in original container. Residents must be 18 years of age or older.

#### **BULKY ITEMS DROP-OFF**



There are several ways to get rid of bulky items that can't go in your trash or recycling cart. Use one of these options or find alternatives using the online Dakota County Green Guide.

- Donate reusable items many organizations provide free pick-up service.
- Ask your trash hauler or a junk company for a one-time, large item pick-up.
- Arrange for a temporary dumpster.
- Bring items to your city's next clean-up event or to one of the businesses listed below.

#### YARD WASTE



Putting yard, garden and tree waste in the trash is illegal. Use one of these options to get rid of your yard waste.

#### Compost at home

Composting at home is easier than you think and you can use it to add nutrients to your soil to reduce the need for fertilizers and pesticides. Buy a bin or build your own.

www.dakotacounty.us, search composting at home.

Dakota County residents get an additional \$15 off already discounted compost bins through the Recycling Association of Minnesota during the annual spring sale. Order a bin at www.recycleminnesota.org.

### Individual curbside collection

Contact your waste hauler to schedule a one-time or recurring yard waste pick-up. Your hauler will provide information on how to prepare your yard waste and any associated fees.

#### **Drop-off locations**

Take your yard waste to a compost site. All yard waste must be in certified-compostable bags, paper bags or reusable containers.
