Dakota County residents made a difference in 2021

- Recycling and composting efforts kept 57 percent of waste out of landfills.
- More than 287,000 pounds of paint, household cleaners and more were given away for reuse at The Recycling Zone.
- Dropped off 146,000 pounds of confidential documents that were shredded and recycled at city-hosted events.
- Composted 1.28 million pounds of food scraps from Organics Drop Off sites.



How to donate

- Check with the donation center to find out hours, what they accept and how to drop off items.
- Inspect your stuff would you give the items to a friend or family member? If not, they might not be worth donating.
- Prep your items. Check the pockets or furniture cubbies. Take out dead batteries from toys and electronics but leave in batteries that work.
- Bring items in a bag or box that you can leave behind.
- Never leave items outside at drop-off locations. The donation center pays the disposal cost for ruined items.
 - Shop for gently used items. Thrift stores depend on the sale of donations.





CHEMICALS, ELECTRONICS &

Many household items, yard and garden chemicals, hazardous waste and electronics are accepted at The Recycling Zone — most for free.

TO DROP OFF, FOLLOW THESE EASY STEPS

- 1. Place items in a box you can leave behind. Keep products in original or labeled container. Schedule an appointment for amounts larger than a pickup truck.
- 2. Put items in the trunk or back of your vehicle. Keep sharps in a container on the front seat.
- Drive up with your ID ready to be scanned. Have a credit card or exact change for TVs, monitors and tires. Check pricing online or call ahead.
- 4. STAY IN YOUR CAR and staff will unload your items.

Do not put shredded paper in your recycling

Shredded paper causes problems at recycling facilities. Bring already shredded paper to The Recycling Zone in a paper bag stapled shut.

VEHICLE BATTERIES

Businesses that sell vehicle batteries are required to accept up to five used batteries per person at one time for free, whether you buy a new battery or not. You can also bring them to The Recycling Zone in Eagan.



HOME RECYCLING

Focus on this list. Put recyclables loose in your recycling container or in a paper bag, do not use plastic bags. Make sure items are empty and dry. Leave caps on containers and flatten all boxes.



PAPER

- Newspaper and inserts
- Magazines and catalogs
- Mail and office papers

CARDBOARD

- Corrugated cardboard
- Paperboard like cracker boxes

CARTONS

- Juice boxes
- Milk and juice cartons
- Soup, broth and wine cartons

FOLLOW YOUR RECYCLING

Bottles, cans and paper go to a local sorting facility where machines and people separate them. Then they travel to manufacturers to make new items.



It is illegal for a hauler to take items in your recycling to a landfill or incinerator. If you suspect your recycling is not being recycled, call Dakota County at 952-891-7557.

YARD WASTE

Did you know?

Putting yard, garden and tree waste in the trash is illegal.

Drop-off sites

Take your yard waste to a compost site. All yard waste must be in certified-compostable plastic bags, paper bags or reusable containers that can be emptied. Sites also offer gardenready compost for purchase.

Home pick-up

Schedule a one-time or recurring yard waste pick-up with your trash hauler.
