Vape Devices not for your trash or recycling.

- Regulated hazardous waste
 - Nicotine can be absorbed through the skin
 - Lithium-ion batteries are toxic and can catch fire when damaged
- Dakota County landfills and recycling facilities
- 5 vape devices thrown away every second in the U.S.
 - 150 million vape devices a year
 - Combined lithium for 6,000 Tesla vehicle batteries

Spring '22 Survey Results

- Dakota County School Survey (sent to all schools)
- Results revealed Dakota County Schools not properly disposing of vape devices

Survey Quotes:

- "... I have crushed them with a hammer and disposed of them in the dumpster."
- "Typically these go into the garbage."
- "We put them in the trash."

Vape Disposal Kit Supplies

- 47 Kits distributed to schools
- Vape Disposal Box with protective material - One per school
- Nitrile or latex gloves Keep a few pairs near box
- Clear, sealable baggies Keep a few bags near box



Safe Storage

- Use the vape disposal box to collect, contain items and prevent risk of exposure and fires.
- Use gloves to limit your exposure to harmful chemicals.
- Liquid nicotine can be absorbed through the skin and cause accidental poisoning.
- Turn off devices to prevent fires if there is an on/off option.
- Bury vape device in protective material inside box.
- Secure lid and keep box in a locked administrative office.





Vape Device Tracking


- Record the date and number of devices placed in box on the tracking form.
- Tracking form is located under the lid with a wet erase marker.
- Information collected is used when scheduling your disposal appointment.



The Process for Disposal

- When the box is full and at the end of the school year, an appointment is scheduled through the <u>Dakota County Very Small</u> <u>Quantity Generator program</u> for proper disposal at The Recycling Zone in Eagan.
- Disposal fees are waived for school collected vaping devices.
- The collection box is brought to your scheduled appointment, emptied and given back for continued use.









To Date:

6 Schools dropped off 280 vape devices and \$304 savings in disposal costs

FAQs

- > Should the battery be removed from the vape device?
 - No, it can be dangerous trying to remove the battery. Leave the battery inside and the whole vape device will be managed properly.
- What should I do with my THC vapes?
 - Vapes containing THC should be brought to your local police department for proper disposal. If you are unable to tell if your device is a nicotine or THC vape, place it in the vape disposal collection box.
- > Who is allowed to transport vape devices on behalf of my school to The Recycling Zone for proper disposal?
 - A school designated staff person is allowed to transport devices after making a VSQG appointment.
- ➤ I have disposal questions regarding other hazardous waste or problem materials at my school. Who do I contact?
