County Manager's Recommendation for the 2020 Maximum Levy

What can be funded at 2.9%:

- All current level cost growth after internal reallocations
- Some funding for new request (consistent with prior years)
- Cahill Place funding
- Co-Response continued as a pilot (expanded to one additional city)
- Increased funding for on-going building CIP maintenance needs (CIP Levy reallocations potentially phased in)






