

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
Plan Purpose:

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

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Transportation:

- Received the most comments, many were technical
- Full Transportation Plan update in 2019 will address many comments
- Maps updated for legibility



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Transportation:

- Apple Valley: 140th trail and pedestrian crossing
- Eagan, Inver Grove Heights: Ten ton route on CSAH26
- Lakeville: Access spacing
- Scott County: ROW need methods differ, requiring coordination



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Transportation:

- MVTA: access vs. mobility on CSAH 42 (transit priority)
- MAC: Air Lake runway extension and future move of Cedar and 225th Street intersection
- **DNR Region 3**: use of wildlife protective practices in road projects
- **DNR MRCCA**: Rule 6106 ROW maintenance provisions


- Received the fewest comments

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Parks


- Burnsville, Rosemount, Three Rivers: Interest in continued greenway collaborations
- Met Council, DNR: Map/text updates to show more areas managed by others





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MN DNR Areas of Significant Biodiversity



- Received moderate number of comments
- Comments related to land resources, water, waste, MRCCA, and other areas



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- Burnsville: interest in County assisting to move waste from Freeway Landfill to Burnsville Landfill
- Lakeville: support water resources objectives
- Ravenna: opposition to Vermillion Watershed standards for site disturbance
- **Rosemount:** interest in stronger County role in waste facility siting



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

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- DNR-MRCCA: ROW maintenance per MN Rule 6106
- DNR Reg. 3: include maps/text for trout streams, calcareous fens, language on nitrate impacts





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- Lower MN WD: recommended ordinance changes to match their standards
- Vermillion River JPO:
 - Emphasized need for sustainable agriculture
 - Assist with TMDL waste-load allocation reductions
 - Add objective to protect high quality infiltration areas
 - New goal for wastewater
 - Infiltrate where appropriate, not everywhere

 Recommend to Physical Development Committee (PDC) to submit draft plan to the Metropolitan Council 	October 25
 PDC receives draft plan, comments, and Planning Commission recommendation. Considers submittal of draft plan to the Metropolitan Council 	November 13
 County Board holds public hearing on the draft County Board acts on plan submittal to the Metropolitan Council 	November 27
 Draft plan sent to the Metropolitan Council for final review and approval (completed within 120 days) 	December
Plan adopted by Board if approved by Met Council	April 2019
