







Findings from the Feasibility Study



Bison wallows:

- serve as disturbance sites allowing seeds to germinate.
- form temporary pools, providing water for other animals on the prairie.
- Anurans use these wallow pools as breeding areas



Findings from the Feasibility Study Seed clings to the animal's fur, assisting in dispersal throughout the prairie Scat provide habitat for insects, disperse seeds and cycle nutrients Grassland birds use bison fur to line their nests Rubbing with their horns helps to minimize woody plant encroachment
