

- Lay the groundwork for developing a Joint Powers Agreement and a Management Agreement with City of Hastings


#### Vision




"The water, vegetation, and wildlife of Dakota County Parks [and Greenways] will be managed to conserve biodiversity, restore native habitats, improve public benefits, and achieve resilience and regionally outstanding quality, now and for future generations (Natural Resources Management System Plan, 2017)."

Improving the ecological value of the public lands outside but adjacent to the County's landholdings and easements

Opportunities to partner with other interested organizations to build larger corridors of conservation land


### Work Plan



- Greenway corridor divided into twelve segments
- Restoration Sequence
- Management and restoration tasks are identified
- · Costs for each task are estimated
- Timeline and implementation schedule developed

Estimate for completing the entire greenway:

- \$915,000
- Phased over 5, 10, or 20 years

#### **Timelines and Schedules**



- August 2022: Contractor was hired
- October 2022: Stakeholder meeting with City of Hastings Park's staff
- August-December 2022: Site survey and background information collected

- February 2023: Draft Plans
- June-July 2023: comment period and final Planning Commission review
- · July 2023: Final public drafts
- August 2023: Final adoption
