Training Requirements - New Applicants

New applicants must complete the following pre-service training requirements prior to licensure. Only qualified trainings through the Minnesota Center for Professional Development are accepted.* These trainings can be found on **Develop** – The Minnesota Quality Improvement and Registry Tool (<https://www.developtoolmn.org>).

All trainings can be access in-person or online except CPR (see guidance below).

Pre-license Training Requirements:

- ✓ Child Growth & Development/Behavior Guidance (one of the following ways):
 - One 4-hour course: Developmentally Appropriate Behavior Guidance
 - Two 2-hour courses in Knowledge and Competency (KCF) area II.C.
 - Two 2-hour courses (one course KCF I + one course KCF II.C.)
- ✓ Supervising for Safety (6 - 8 hours depending on in-person or online)
- ✓ Pediatric CPR (must be completed in person)
- ✓ First Aid
- ✓ SUID – Sudden Unexpected Infant Death (required when caring for children ages birth – 1 year)
- ✓ AHT – Abusive Head Trauma (required when caring for children ages birth – 5 years)
- ✓ Child Passenger Restraint (if intend to transport children)

* CPR training must be provided by American Red Cross, American Heart Association, or other nationally recognized, evidence-based program for CPR training and incorporate psychomotor skills to support the instruction. First aid training must be provided by an individual approved to provide first aid instruction.
