We want to hear directly from the person who needs help. We will determine your eligibility and find resources and options available to you.

If preferred, you can call or walk-in with a relative or friend to support you. Walk-in hours: Monday - Friday 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

If you have health insurance (private insurance, Medical Assistance, Minnesota Care, Medicare or PMAP), please check with your health care plan for information about access to mental health services.
