MAN PLEADS GUILTY AND IS SENTENCED FOR KILLING TWO CONSTRUCTION WORKERS ON 35W IN BURNSVILLE

Dakota County Attorney James Backstrom announced that Kirk Edward Deamos, age 23 of Raymore, Missouri, pled guilty late today to one count of Careless Driving (a misdemeanor), in connection with crash that occurred on October 13, 2011 on 35W in Burnsville that killed 47-year-old Craig Carlson of Ramsey and 44-year-old Ronald Rajkowski of St. Joseph, who were working as electricians at the construction site along this roadway. Deamos was sentenced by Judge Arlene Perkkio to 30 days in jail, 200 hours of community work service and a fine of \$100.

Backstrom indicated that under current Minnesota law felony charges were not possible in this case because no alcohol or drugs were involved, gross negligence could not be proved and Deamos did not flee the scene of the crash.

Backstrom noted that he has been attempting to increase the penalty for careless (negligent) driving resulting in death to a gross misdemeanor since 2007. "This is another tragic example of the need to have a law in place that deals with taking negligent risks while driving that reflect it is more serious to hit and kill a human being than it is to damage a mailbox," Backstrom commented. Backstrom said he is pursuing adoption of such a law once again this year at the Minnesota Legislature.
