

Label Standards for Hauler-Supplied Containers

Published: April 29, 2020 Updated: April 5, 2021

Dakota County Ordinance 110, Solid Waste Management, was amended in 2019 to implement strategies in the 2018-2030 Solid Waste Master Plan to reduce waste going to landfills, improve the quality of materials recycled, and make progress toward the state's goal to recycle 75 percent of waste by 2030.

New hauler requirements in Ordinance 110 to label containers include:

- Haulers must provide container labels that follow County waste abatement messaging standards.
 Specifically, that all recycling, organics, and trash containers (e.g., carts, dumpsters, roll-offs, compactors) must be properly labeled and must:
 - Indicate the material type collected, and use the term Trash, Recycle or Recycling, and Organics (if collected). Other waste types must be labeled with the materials accepted.
 - Show images consistent with County standards of materials accepted in recycling and organics (if collected) containers.
 - Be color-coded (blue for recycling, green for organics, gray or black for trash).
 - Be visible and legible to users.
 - Include preparation requirements consistent with County standards, where applicable.

This requirement goes into effect:

- in 2020 for containers purchased after December 31, 2019, and
- by 2022 for containers purchased prior to January 1, 2020.

Label Placement: Labels are intended to be an educational tool to help generators properly dispose of waste. Affix labels where they are visible to generators, such as on the lid of a cart, and the front and sides of a dumpster. It is also a best practice that labels be placed on containers in areas that avoid being damaged by truck lift equipment or a mechanical arm.

Dakota County developed the following standardized standards to be used by haulers to meet ordinance requirements for labeling containers. HAULER CONTAINER LABEL STANDARDS

RECYCLE LABEL

A. Required Terminology and Content

Haulers must use the following terminology and content on container labels:

Title Term: Recycle or Recycling

Subtitle Terms

- Paper and Cardboard
- Cartons
- Cans
- Glass
- Plastics

Material Preparation Statement: empty and dry

Label Color: Blue (prefer dark blue)

B. Required Images

- **I. Icon.** Labels must contain the recycling arrow (mobius).
- II. Required images for what to recycle. Haulers must use the following required County images on labels (alternative images and icons may be used with County approval*). The Paper and Cardboard images can be grouped (e.g., Paper and Cardboard) or kept separate. Required images and icons are available at www.dakotacounty.us, search waste industry recycling requirements.





- **III.** Required images and content for items not accepted in recycling containers. Haulers must use the following standardized wording and icons to demonstrate what does not belong in the recycling container for each problem item category:
 - Do not bag recyclables
 - No plastic bags or plastic wrap
 - No tanglers (cord, hoses or chains)
 - No food
 - No batteries

- ***Allowable alternative images and icons.** Alternative images and icons must be approved by the County <u>prior</u> to hauler use in messaging.
 - a. What to recycle. Alternative images and icons of what to recycle must include the items listed below to demonstrate what belongs in the recycling container for each material category:

- b. **What to keep out of the recycling.** Alternative images and icons must demonstrate what does not belong in the recycling container for each problem item category:
 - Do not bag recyclables
 - No plastic bags or plastic wrap
 - No tanglers (cords, hoses or chains)
 - No food
 - No batteries

ORGANICS LABEL

A. Required Terminology and Content

Haulers must use the following terminology and content on container labels.

Title Term: Organics

Subtitle Term: Food Scraps

Label Color: Green

B. Required Images

I. Icon. There is no icon requirement that represents organics, but the County recommends an apple core.

II. Required images for accepted organics. Haulers must use the below required County images of items to demonstrate what is accepted in organics containers (alternative images and icons may be used with County approval**).

- **III.** Required images for items not accepted in organics. Haulers must use the following content and corresponding icons to demonstrate what does not belong in the organics container for each problem item category:
 - No recyclables
 - No yard waste
 - No trash

- **IV.** **Allowable alternative images and icons. Alternative images and icons must be approved by the County <u>prior</u> to hauler use on organics labels.
 - a. What belongs in the organics. Alternative images and icons must include items listed below (must show <u>each</u> category) to demonstrate what belongs in the organics container:

Bakery and Dry Goods	Sandwich (bread) with bite mark
Dairy Products	Cheese
Eggs and Eggshells	Eggshell
Meat, Fish and Bones	Chicken leg with bite mark

- b. What to keep out of the organics. Alternative images and icons must use the below content and corresponding images or icons to demonstrate what does not belong in the organics container for each problem item category:
 - No recyclables
 - No yard waste
 - No trash


A. Required Terminology and Content

Label Color: Gray or black
