

Construction Update – 2023 Dakota County Overlay & Misc. Projects

What's Being Done?

Dakota County will rehabilitate approximately 16.85 miles of pavement as part of the overlay contract this construction season. Pavement rehabilitation involves removing and replacing asphalt, "mill and overlay", on the driving lanes and shoulders of the roadway. The end product will be better looking, longer lasting and smoother roadway.

However, more than just pavement will be rehabilitated this season. Other work will include miscellaneous concrete work and minor utility adjustments and improvements. Improvements will be made to some of the signal systems. The access road to Lebanon Hills and Camp Sacajawea will also be resurfaced.

When Will Work Take Place?

Construction on County Road 11 from County Road 42 to County Road 38 (McAndrews Road) in Burnsville and along County Road 38 (McAndrews Road) from County Road 11 to Garden View Drive in Apple Valley and Burnsville is scheduled to begin July 11th, 2023, with trail reclamation work beginning first, followed by paving. The paving is expected to last a week.

What Should I Expect?

Drivers should expect temporary lane closures, flaggers, and delays throughout the project. Please allow extra time for travel, watch for construction signage and be cautious while driving through the construction area.
