Re-imagining Library Services

During the pandemic, the library safely provided in-person services in new ways, allowing customers to drop by the library for express services.

Online library card registration was introduced, allowing new customers immediate access to the library's digital resources. To help offset stress and economic challenges, library fines for overdue items were suspended.

Launched Curbside Pick-up and Expanded Books by Mail

The library launched Curbside Pick-up service and an expanded Books by Mail program for individuals unable to visit the library due to illness, disability, or who are designated high risk for severe illness from COVID-19. 654 books were mailed to customers April through December using Books By Mail.

Innovated New Program Formats

The library provided customers with a variety of live and recorded programs including author talks, book group discussions, storytimes, ASL classes, hands-on multi generational arts classes, job search and small business classes funded by the CARES Act, and more. With community partners, the library created Take and Make Kits, hands-on activities that can be picked up and brought home to enjoy.

Enhanced Internet Access

The library moved quickly to boost Wi-Fi signals at all branch locations, extending them into library parking lots. Later in 2020, funded in part by the CARES Act, the Minnesota Department of Education and a Library Services and Technology Act grant, the library introduced Wi-Fi hotspots and Chromebook Kits at all locations, providing free internet access and connectivity at home or on the go.

Expanded Digital Collections and Online Resources

To support our communities as residents transitioned to working, studying, and staying at home, the library proactively expanded its digital collections and online resources. More than 1,001,789 digital materials were checked out in 2020 — an increase of 27% compared to the same span in 2019.

Reinvented Summer Discovery

The library reinvented its Summer Discovery reading and learning program, creatively offering curbside pick-up options and partnering with six local school districts to provide free books and activity logs to over 23,000 youth.

Provided Summer Meals to Youth

The library partnered with Youthprise, ISD 200 Hastings Public Schools, and the Minnesota Department of Education to provide meals for pick up to help prevent nutrition from being a roadblock to health and learning. Our Pleasant Hill location hosted a school district vehicle on site and served 1,200 meals. Our Burnhaven and Wentworth locations provided 9,646 meals to youth — a 550% increase from 2019.

Recommitted to Diversity, Equity and Inclusion

In 2020, the library recommitted to challenge inequity and elevate conversation and learning around the issues of race, inclusion and belonging. Several virtual library programs highlighted diverse perspectives, including Indians in America, a series presented by Eugene Fracek, member of the Rosebud Sioux Tribe, a Spanish and English bilingual storytime series with Dakota County Parks, Celebrating Somali Youth Voices, and more. Throughout the year, staff built skills and practices rooted in diversity and inclusion, participating in trainings to grow cultural awareness, examine library practices, and apply anti-bias frameworks to advance equity and opportunity for all.
